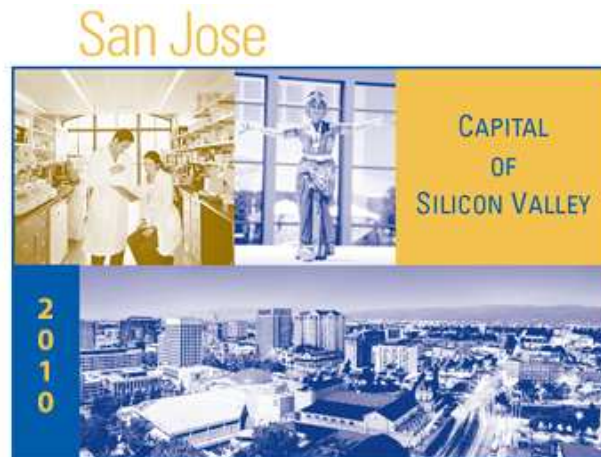

Economic Strategy Update



You are invited to offer input on the Economic Strategy Update 2010-2015 at a San Jose City Council Study Session, 1:30 to 5 p.m., Monday, February 8, in the Council Chambers at San Jose City Hall, 200 E. Santa Clara Street.

In November of 2003, the City Council adopted San Jose's first Economic Strategy, which was intended to guide the City's economic development direction for about five years. Over the last five years, the City and its partners have made significant strides in implementing the 15 Strategic Initiatives adopted in 2003, and San Jose's Economic Strategy has been recognized as a model. Also over the last five years, change has continued relentlessly in San Jose/Silicon Valley and in our national/global context. City leaders and residents want San Jose well-prepared to benefit as much as possible from the eventual economic recovery.

The 2010 Economic Strategy builds on this success and establishes a vision for how San Jose can excel economically and how the City and its partners can work together to achieve the vision. It includes clarification of the community's goals, fact-based assessment of the community's distinctive advantages, its vulnerabilities existing economic base, and external competition and trends.

Who Is Eligible?

The CAP Grant Program provides financial support to help resident-based groups conduct activities that build or strengthen the neighborhood organization, improve neighborhood conditions, or address issues important to neighborhood quality of life.

### ***WebGrants– Citywide grants management system***

Beginning January 25, 2010 the City's electronic grant management system, known as WebGrants became available on the internet to agencies seeking grants from the City of San Jose. With the deployment of the system, grant seeking agencies will experience the convenience of a single point of entry to view and apply for active City grant opportunities. Once an agency registers in WebGrants their information remains in the system eliminating the need to resubmit general information with each grant application. In addition, other standard grant transactions such as status reports can be carried out through the online system.

WebGrants also allows City staff to meet the demands of collecting, tracking and reporting on its grant-making portfolio. With this automated system the City will make substantial progress towards a more paperless grant management process.

To register for WebGrants visit <http://www.sanjoseca.gov/prns/grants.asp>. Once your registration has been approved, your agency will be able to view and apply for City Grants as they become available through the WebGrants system.
